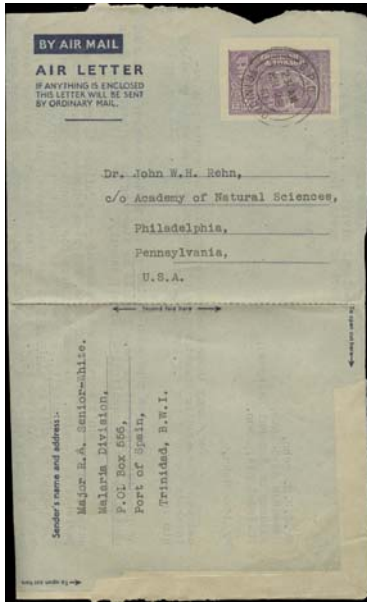

My dear Rehn,

Very many thanks indeed for the four reprints just received. The aquatic insect survey of Breadfruit Creek would greatly interest Messrs of the F.W. Biological Lab, Singapore. Did you meet him in Bureau?

Your two papers on sialinsins in Puerto Rico are, of course, of immediate interest to me. I shall be starting on egg activation in *aquasalis* and *neoaquasalis* myself shortly.

I don't know what to make of your failure to find dense outdoor resting adults. Such, also, has been Whithead Thomson's experience in Jamaica. He came down here for a month and studied out door resting in *aquasalis*, and went back thinking that hitherto he has looked for this in *aquasalis* in too dark spots, but since his return he has had no better luck. All he can say is that my outdoor resting scrub is quite different to scrub in Jamaica. Perhaps the next move is a botanical-mological study of scrub in the above islands. Your beast must be somewhere, but, closely related as it is syntomically to mine, in this respect they are quite different. Actually, you seem to have had more luck with rock resting, in this respect making findings not dissimilar to mine with *signa*, but I can't find an area where *signa* and *aquasalis* co-exist, to make relative resting plank count. Anyway, I think you've got further than Whithead Thomson, and it's a thousand pities they took you off the job. Miranda is now here, and tells me that you are now teaching up in Vermont, but doesn't know your exact address. I hope Philadelphia will find you.

An off home is three weeks for a couple of months.
